PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE



The New Strategy

We've had several succession workshops to develop our new strategy for Fernwood; bringing in new ideas, experience and skills. The strategy outlines our overarching aims for the village; how we achieve these aims is broken down in our full action plan which can be found on the Fernwood Parish Council website.

- We will continue to maintain the Costall Woods
- Continue with the plan to take ownership of the open spaces in Fernwood
- Work with FirstPort to look at the provision of a better play park
- Work with N&SDC to ensure the new developments are without the implementation/use of management companies
- Work with NSDC to review CCTV on Ruby's Walk and nearby playing field
- Arrange village signage and update letterheads
- Lobby NCC & Via for improvements to parking, particularly Goldstraw Lane
- Expand the calendar of events to encourage wider community engagement
- Maintain & promote Fernwood Village Hall
- Continue investigating the possibility of extending the village hall
- Continue to support the Friday night youth club
- Lobby NCC to improve bus services serving Fernwood
- Lobby for all roads to be maintained, safe and suitable for purpose.
- Investigate the future plans regarding for water tower

This list doesn't cover everything; there's still plenty of other business including things like poo bins, policies, consultations and supporting community organisations! We'll also be publishing a full breakdown on how we plan to start attacking some of the above on our website and social media. As councillors, we're committed to working in the best interest of all residents in Fernwood, listening to opinions and to create a vibrant place for everyone who lives here. Whilst some of the above isn't directly within our control, we're promising to lobby for change and encourage residents to feedback thoughts or concerns with Fernwood Parish Council.

Councillors meet most months to discuss issues raised by residents, planning & strategy. Residents are welcome at the first 15 minutes of each meeting for open discussion.



Bat & bird box making

Our community bat and bird box making session at the beginning of June were a great success with 19 boxes made. They'll be put up in Costall Woods soon! Thanks to the ranger, Simon, from Sconce Park (N&SDC) for his help and all the residents that attended.

The new wildlife garden behind Marron Court was seeded/planted back in April and is now being watered regularly to give the new shrubs and plants the best chance of survival - even in this hot summer sun. The majority of the garden is seeded and not planted so this is why it will take longer to mature and sometimes seem messy. You might spot some weeds but we've been assured by our contractor that these will be sorted soon and it's likely to take 1.5 - 2 years before the wildlife garden really starts to shine. In May, ecologists from EMEC conducted a nocturnal bat survey on the final tree which was earmarked for felling by our tree specialists. They found **no bat roosts** during the survey but they identified an active Blue Tit using the tree. With this is mind, they recommended that we pollard the tree to a height of 6 metres after bird nesting season which will happen later in the year.

OTHER VILLAGE UPDATES



Rumble Strips

Several residents contacted the parish council regarding noise and vibrations from the rumble strips near their homes. This is unfortunately out of our jurisdiction but we have been in contact with Via East Midlands & NCC about possible alternatives which would allow for people crossing and reduce speed. We'll continue to share residents' concerns on this & make recommendations.



Hollowdyke Lane

The last resident survey suggested residents are concerned about the speed on Hollowdyke Lane. The new council reviewed evidence that showed most traffic isn't sticking to the current advisory 20mph signage. We made recommendations to Via East Midlands that Community Infrastructure Levy could be used to reduce the limit to 30mph. As this offer was rejected, we have requested that missing road signs are replaced so the current speed limit is clear to drivers.



Funding news

Recently, councillors agreed to the following requests:

- Free village hall usage for a carers' group once a month
- Free usage for new Knit & Knatter group starting September
- The council also agreed to award £200 to Fernwood Petanque Club for piste renovations.



THE HISTORY OF RAF BALDERTON PART 2 - 1941



No.106 Squadron re-formed in June 1938 as a Bomber Squadron to act as a training unit within No.5 Group. On the outbreak of WW2 it was flying a mix of twin engined Avro Ansons and Handley-Page Hampdens. In February 1941 C Flight at Finningley became No.25 Operational Training Unit (OTU), in March as part of No.7 Group to train night bomber crews; Vickers Wellingtons replacing the Hampdens. Balderton became a satellite to RAF Finningley and No.25 OTU had personnel and aircraft detached there from June to November 1941. The following are extracts from the units ORB

The advance party moved to Balderton on the 14 June and on the 16th B Flight with 6 Wellingtons (above) and 6 Hampdens under the command of S/Ldr. Oxley DFC moved to Balderton.

The 19 July saw night flying cancelled at 0100 following enemy action – a stick of bombs were dropped across the aerodrome causing no damage. Local Defence Company Syerston agreed to take over the defence of the aerodrome from 0830 on the 22 July.

Wellington P4318 crashed across the Great North Road through an overshoot on the 2 August, whilst on the 7th ten bombs were dropped from low altitude from the NE corner of the aerodrome Northwards in the direction of the new hospital, no damage or casualties.

Saturday 16 August at 0030 Hampden X2959 was on night circuits and landings when the aircraft hit trees on Grove Street and crashed into houses on London Road Balderton and burst into flames. Two crew, W Op/Air Gunner Sergeant Thomas G. Wood and Pilot Sergeant Sidney D. Baldachin both aged 20, and 6 children who were asleep in No.84, Geoffrey 18, Joyce 14, Mary 13, Alan 12, Lucy 9 and Sheila Brumpton 6 all died; their mother managed to escape with her youngest son Roy 3. Their father, working on the railway, saw the crash and thought that it was near his home but carried on working until his shift finished at 6am. The third crew member, Air Gunner Sergeant David Macdonald survived by dropping through the hole in the fuselage created when the aircraft crashed.

A Guard of Honour led by FO Cattell from RAF Balderton attended the children's funeral.

THE HISTORY OF RAF BALDERTON -

continued

Another bombing raid on the 22 August saw approximately 8 bombs and 100 incendiaries dropped without damage. On the 8 and 9 September dive bombing exercises were carried out with the RE detachment in Newark.

The unit left Balderton for RAF Bawtry (later RAF Bircotes) on the 14 November under the command of S/Ldr. Wrinch.

No.408 RCAF Squadron with Handley-Page Hampden (left) medium bombers arrived in December 1941.

Squadrons numbered in the 400 series were technically units of the RCAF, RAAF and RNZAF but placed under the operational control of the RAF as part of its organisational structure. These Squadrons were born out of Article XV of the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan of January 1941 which called for 25 Canadian Squadrons to be formed.

In June 1941 No.408 Goose Squadron as it was to become known formed as part of No.5 Group, the second RCAF bomber squadron overseas at RAF Lindholme Yorkshire, moving to RAF Syerston in July 1941 and in December to Balderton under the command of W/Cdr. Nelles W. Timmerman DSO DFC.

Initially living quarters were at Syerston, the airfield was grass, occasionally mud or snow; the Messes about a mile away from the airfield. There was no control tower but a van with an Aldis lamp and Very pistol.

25 December - The usual festivities took place on this station this Christmas Day, the Sergeants being entertained in the Officers Mess followed by the Officers and Sergeants proceeding to the Airmens Mess where they served Christmas Dinner for the airmen.

By the end of December the Squadron had flown 343 operational sorties with the loss of six crews and eleven Hampdens.
