PLAY PARK UPDATE

At the beginning of the year, the Parish Council created a working group to look at the play park in central Fernwood and potential redevelopment opportunities to benefit residents, especially children and young people. The current play park is over twenty years old and in need of redevelopment, especially as the village continues to grow so quickly and our needs change.

We have met with several stakeholders over the last six months to understand possibilities of the area and potential costs, as well as conducted research with specialists. As the Parish Council don't own the land, we have been in talks with FirstPort and Barratt David Wilson Homes to make sure all considerations are made for residents of Central Fernwood who currently pay a maintenance fee for the area. We expect this work to cost a significant amount of money; the Parish Council are offering full funding for the removal of the old park and installation of new equipment, using Community Infrastructure Levy [CIL] to fund these redevelopments. At the moment estimates are around £200,000 based on the research we have completed, although this will be confirmed once we have received proposals from suppliers.

At our July meeting, we agreed to a formal request for tender from suppliers and some key dates. During the process, we'll meet with suppliers to answer any questions & show them the site whilst being supported by key stakeholders to review and evaluate bids before deciding on a way forward. There will also be consultation with residents before any decision is made. We are hoping to have made a decision on supplier by Autumn 2024, with the aim being that the new park will be installed by beginning of 2025.

We're hoping to share more information with residents as soon as possible, as well as continue to share updates on social media and at our regular Parish Council meetings. Residents with any immediate questions regarding the redevelopment are invited to attend a meeting or submit questions to Clerk. Full information on the tender will be on the website and government portal as soon as possible.

VILLAGE HALL UPDATE

Over the last few months the village hall has been undergoing some long overdue renovations. This includes a lick of paint throughout, new blinds and new garden landscaping. It's safe to say users are loving the brighter, modernised and cleaner look to the hall. We do still have a few future updates to complete and are working with the village hall management group to continue to make the hall the best it can be; these will happen over time and we thank everyone for their patience and feedback.

In 2024 we have seen a drastic increase in bookings at the village hall; this has come from regular hire bookings, weekly classes and ad-hoc bookings such as parties etc. The staff team at the village hall have been working hard to ensure the hall is profitable and continues to be a hub for the community, but identified early into the financial year just how limited space was becoming due to the increase in bookings. After being approached by the owner of Balderton Hall and conducting some investigations into the space on offer, at our July meeting it was agreed that the Parish Council will lease a section of Balderton Hall. This gives us considerable meeting room and business spaces, kitchen facilities and outdoor gardens. Importantly it also gives us access to 11 additional parking spaces near the woodland, plus access to the full carpark at Balderton Hall on evenings and weekends. The Parish Council agreed to lease this space for five years at a cost of £29,700 which will be used from Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and is inclusive of most utilities. We will also agree a budget to furnish at our September meeting. We expect this to have a really positive impact for all residents, introduce new business spaces to hire and elevate some of the parking challenges outside the shops in central Fernwood, especially when the main village hall is hired for parties.

Our current aim is to be in the space by October 1st 2024. Booking of the village hall remains unchanged and the hall will continue to focus its bookings on parties and large classes. The Parish Council would like to say a huge thank you to the staff team for their hard work and due diligence on exploring this opportunit.

Fernwood Village Hall is an excellent choice of venue for all of your celebrations plus Fernwood residents are eligible for a reduced rate! We also offer a fully licensed bar provided by Cox Events. Dear resident,

We are pleased to be writing to you again in this summer issue of the Fernwood Gazette, offering us an opportunity to reflect on our work and meetings since our last column which focussed primarily on council tax and glass recycling.

ASB – Car Meets

We are aware of local concern regarding anti-social behaviour; in fact, we have included details of how to report ASB in previous issues. We have also spoken at the Policy and Performance Improvement Committee and have drawn attention to the importance of the Council focussing efforts on encouraging the reporting of ASB, highlighting that a reduction in ASB reported does not necessarily mean there has been a reduction in ASB. Most recently we have been contacted about car meets in Fernwood and we have written to both the Council's Community Protection Manager and the Police District Commander for our area to seek assistance. We have been asked to encourage residents to report these matters to the police including details of what has happened, the make, colour and model of the vehicle and the number plate details. We are pleased to let you know that, following our communication with the Police, the District Commander has assured us that the dedicated Police ASB car will be deployed in Fernwood over the summer.

Local Healthcare

At a recent full council meeting we voted for and spoke on a motion regarding out of hours medical care in Newark, following the attendance of NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care Board and Sherwood Forest Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust at the Policy and Performance Improvement Committee. We also questioned the Council's Portfolio Holder for Health and Wellbeing – an additional post created by the Council's administration and held by a Councillor from the ruling coalition – about what she has done in the last year with regards to working with these bodies to represent the health concerns of residents across Newark and Sherwood. We support the efforts of our local Member of Parliament, Robert Jenrick, who is campaigning for the 24/7 urgent treatment centre in Newark to be reinstated – an issue that we know matters to residents and their families across our ward.

Young Debaters

We were delighted to recently host young people and leaders from 6th Newark Cub Scouts for a debate night in the Council Chamber at Castle House, NSDC's HQ. The young people demonstrated a great amount of community spirit and debated with decorum and tenacity, perhaps some will find themselves on a path to being future councillors... If you or someone you know runs a similar group, based in our ward, do not hesitate to get in touch if you wish to organise a debate night with us.

D-DAY 80 MEMORIAL

Thank you to all who attended the D-Day 80 year commemorations on the 6th June at the village hall. Parish councillors were joined by staff, local residents and District Council to remember those involved in D-Day with a coffee morning and information inside the hall with the support of the RAF Balderton Memorial Group. It was also lovely to have some of the children from the local nursey attend to find out more about Fernwood and Balderton's involvement in the war. We also unveiled a new memorial bench in the gardens of the village hall; two more will also be made this year by a local resident for free out of the wood from the fallen tree in the gardens which was estimated to be over 150 years old. The bench will soon be cemented into place and a memorial plaque added. Thank you to all involved in the event and to the RAF Balderton Memorial Group for their support and to Geoff Bowers for the fab photos.



CASUAL COUNCILLOR VACANCY

Fernwood Parish Council posted a public notice to advise a Parish Councillor vacancy at Fernwood back in May. Individuals who are on the Electoral Register were then able to contact the Returning Officer at NSDC if they wished to call for an election to replace Mr McGregor.

We were advised by The Returning Officer at NSDC that they did not receive a request from ten electors (the minimum number required) in writing to claim a poll by the 31st May deadline. The Parish Council can now fill the vacancy by co-option. Our aim is to have filled this position by September 2024.

LAND OWNERSHIP UPDATE

Residents may have seen that in May, the Parish Council voted to no longer pursue land ownership in Central Fernwood. The land in Central Fernwood is owned by Barratt David Wilson Homes, who have licensed the land to FirstPort to maintain for 999 years. At the moment, this affects around 900 properties who pay a maintenance fee to FirstPort. The previous Parish Council had been pursuing taking over this land for several years.

The due diligence to make this decision has taken several years and spanned more than one group of councillors. It has included legal advise and many recommendations from third parties, as well as new councillors reviewing key documents. Based on the information available to the Council at the point of voting plus current law, it was resolved not to continuing pursuing the acquisition of this land at this time. Whilst the decision needed to happen in a closed session due to the nature of the information presented, residents were welcome to attend the public forum of the meeting. The Parish Council have also discussed this matter at other meetings and listened to residents opinions.

We understand this decision is a contentious one, with many people feeling strongly for and against pursing the land. Staff are in the process of producing a report on how the council came to this decision. There is considerable data to protect spreading many years and protected information we legally have to redact in order to be able to share the information, which will take some time to compile.

We thank residents for their patience whilst we work through this process.


NEW STALLS AT THE HALL

The HISTORY of RAF BALDERTON – part 6 – the Americans



All US tactical air support units in Great Britain were consolidated into the Ninth Air Force on 16 October 1943, at the same time the IX Troop Carrier Command (TCC) was created. Twelve RAF Stations including Balderton were designated for the new command, each to house 40 C-47s (Dakotas) and a similar number of gliders.

Balderton known and referred to as Station AAF-482 by the USAAF was officially taken over by the US on New Year's Day 1944 and used as a reception centre for C-47 troop carrier groups arriving from the United States before relocating to other UK airfields. There was accommodation for 2,471 personnel. The 308th Station Complement Squadron were the first arrivals (responsible for ground traffic, safety, housing and air traffic control) to adapt and coordinate procedures with RAF personnel in preparation for the later Squadrons. Each GI, issued a bicycle on arrival and when the why? was asked was told 'when the planes arrive they will be parked in widely scattered areas over the field – no reason to give Jerry the chance to destroy a lot of C.47s with a single bomb!'

The first USAAF transport unit arrived during January 1944 from Baer Army Airfield Indiana. A ground school was set up to familiarise the aircrews with flying control, radio procedures and navigation aids in the U. On the 5/6 February this group went to RAF Ramsbury Wilts.

On the 21 February, the 91st and 92nd Troup Carrier Squadrons and the advance party of the 439th Troup Carrier Group, commanded by Col. Charles H. Young, arrived from Baer Airfield. Two further squadrons, the 93rd and 94th arriving on the 6 March having flown via Florida, Puerto Rico, British Guyana, Brazil, Senegal West Africa and Marrakech Morocco before a 10½ hour flight landing at St Mawgan. As the 94th Squadron history reported they had a quick medical, picked up some material as security (?) and exchanged their notes for the 'very strange' English money, they completed their journey to Balderton landing on a snow covered airfield.

Training began on the 8 March with two sorties per day flying in group and squadron formations, glider towing using British Horsa gliders and paratroop missions. The ground echelon of the 439th TCG had arrived by sea aboard the George Washington at Liverpool on the 10th travelling to Balderton by rail arriving on the 11th. American Waco CG-4A gliders arrived at the end of March.

The strength of 93 Squadron on the 31 March was 84 Officers and 265 enlisted men; the 94th 85 Officers and 270 men.

Balderton's facilities were found to be somewhat lacking from an American point of view as the 94th Squadron history recorded: 'Everyone was no little dismayed at the first glance of our new home – the Officers were billeted in a huge cylindrical converted mess hall, graced by four inadequate stoves, which, no matter how hot, could not possibly heat the vastness of the interior. The British stove seems designed to carry heat from the hot coals directly up the flue and out over the top of the building...

The enlisted men were barracked in the Squadron area, half a mile from the nearest water supply. Their only compensation was living in comparatively small buildings which could be heated some little – provided, of course, coal was available, which it usually wasn't! Mess facilities were rather makeshift pending the arrival of the Ground Echelon – the men found it necessary to walk about three-quarters of a mile from their area to a mess hall at another site'

As one Glider pilot wrote - Balderton was our first station in England and quite an eye-opener. Imagine being next to Sherwood Forest! It was a shock of the unfamiliar to many – warm beer, honeybuckets (portable toilets), washing in troughs in unheated washrooms and, considered by many the worst, orange marmalade! A favourite memory of one glider pilot is the question-and-answer show held for the children near the back fence. The subject, U.S. history and the prize a scarce sweet, I still remember the round-faced chubby boy who won a chocolate bar with almonds for naming the first U.S. president. This continued until we moved to Upottery. Lifelong Balderton Man Doug Clarke remembered not only sweets and Chocolate but the occasional tin of Spam to take home and the family feeling rich!

Bud Berry (picture right- his own photo) C-47 pilot, 91st Squadron writes - Most of the time that I left the base I went to Nottingham and enjoyed the city; I met a young lady and enjoyed a few meals and conversation with her family. We were there for such a short time that most of my memories have to do with practice flights and Missions flown. Efforts were made to create liveable conditions and a 48 hour pass system introduced with London, Nottingham and the quieter, perhaps more typically English 'town' of Lincoln, its Cathedral visited in force, Thrice weekly movies were shown.

24 hour passes were eagerly used and daily 'liberty' runs to Nottingham and Newark were established. Newark with its dances and pubs provided entertainment.

A dance arranged for the enlisted men in Balderton using the Theatre Building saw the group orchestra supplying the music and Newark and Balderton supplying the girls. A similar event for the Officers and Nurses, complete with liquid refreshment and the orchestra doing its bit and local talent providing entertainment saw the Mayor of Newark, his wife and the ladies of Balderton attend. (Note for enlisted men 'girls', for Officers 'ladies'!!)

The airfield became busy when used for glider training by the USAAF in preparation for the Invasion of Europe (D Day). Training with paratroops of the 82nd Airborne Division was conducted from Balderton until the 439th moved to RAF Upottery Devon on 26 April.

Operating in France in September, the 439th group returned to Balderton and towed gliders and dropped paratroops of the 82nd Airborne near Nijmegen during Operation Market. On the 17 September No.439 TCG had fifty C.47 aircraft towing one glider each and thirty C.47 aircraft carrying Paratroops take off at 11.35 Hours, all aircraft returned safely at about 16.00 Hours. On the 18th 50 Waco Gliders flew to landing Zone N landing at 1518.




